

Thai Union's Tuna Commitment and it's FIP Roadmap

Thai Union's commitment is for all of our branded tuna to be sustainably sourced. We achieved the milestone that we originally set for completion by 2020, for a minimum of 75 percent of our global branded tuna to be sourced from MSC certified fisheries and FIPs. At the end of 2020 this total was 87 percent. We now have new ambitious milestones to achieve by 2025, which include our FIPs moving to full assessment and achieving MSC certification. This will see the FIPs continue to address environmental challenges within the fishery and improve to meet operational best practice. Thai Union's Global Tuna Commitment is built around traceability and is designed to address stock sustainability, labor issues and Illegal, Unregulated and Unreported (IUU) fishing in the global skipjack, yellowfin, bigeye and albacore fisheries.
